

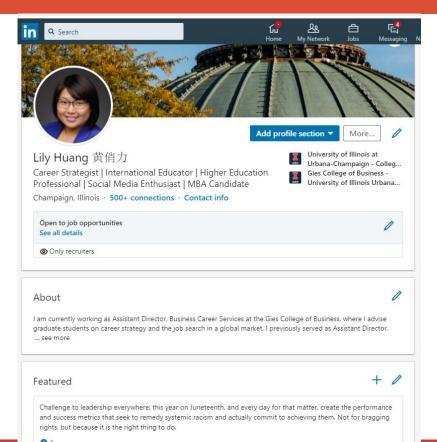

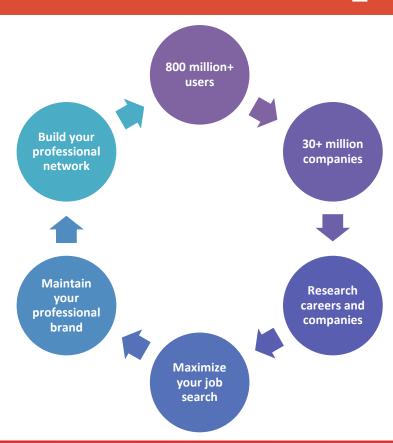

- YOUR identity
- Consistent with your resume

Headline

- Your tagline
- Your most recent experience/position (automatic)
- Concise professional statement
- Keywords desired industry, passion, interests
- What you are excited about now, what you want to do in the future

Summary

- Your "elevator pitch"
- Short, concise
- Authentic
- Share metrics, accomplishments
- Talents, interests
- Tell a story use "I" statements!
- No spelling and grammar mistakes

Recommended summary content

- 2-3 paragraphs
 - 1st paragraph: describe current situation
 - 2nd paragraph: articulate your professional aspirations, brief work history/accomplishments
 - Optional 3rd paragraph: some personal information, interests
 - Optional list of skills/specialties



Sample Summary

I am a graduate student at the University of Illinois, Gies College of Business. I am working towards a Master of Science in Accountancy, with a concentration in Data Analytics.

Currently, I am seeking a full-time position where I can utilize my international background and talents in the areas of strategic thinking, cultural competency, and relationship building for the summer of 2022. During my summer internship at the Hope Bank of New York, I received a lot of hands-on training with customer service in an financial institution. After that, I knew I made the right choice in pursuing an accounting degree and the exciting industry of business analytics.

As an undergraduate student at the University of Hawaii, I have engaged in multiple campus activities. I was an active member of the Cultural Ambassador Program and Student Union Programming Board. I also spent the Fall semester of 2018 studying abroad in Kyoto, Japan where I enrolled in multiple classes including Japanese history, society, and language.

Experience, Organizations, Volunteering and Causes

- Dates of employment/involvement
- Employer/organization name with logo
- Add photos, videos, links of your work
- Details about your work responsibilities
 - Mention the most relevant experience; okay to leave off experiences
 - Include internships, part-time jobs, unpaid jobs
 - 2 writing options:
 - Short, single line bullet points (similar to resumes)
 - Full sentences, short paragraphs (preferred)
 - Focus on major achievements
 - Do NOT copy from your resume





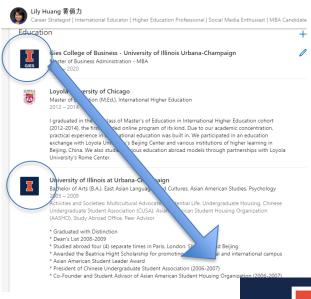
Sample Description

In this position, I **led a 5-person team** that managed a **50+ client portfolio**, **launched** the firm's first app download campaign and partnered with stakeholders to **minimize risk** and **streamline client communication**. Through my efforts, my team **increased** annual revenue **by 150%**, and team performance **by 33%**.



Education

- Both undergraduate and graduate education must be listed
- Use the schools' logos!
 - Links to your school's page
 - Very helpful when trying to connect to alumni and when recruiters are looking for you!
 - Pro-tip: type in "Gies" to get the specific Gies logo!
- Add achievements or narrative







Skills and Endorsements

2 kinds of skills

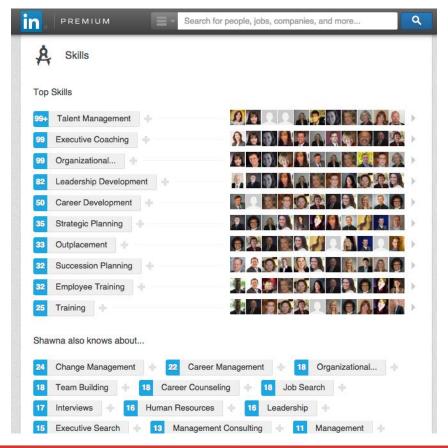
- Transferrable skills
 - · Writing, analysis, research, problem solving
- Industry/job specific skills
 - Project management, Python, financial management

Recommendation for identifying skills

- Look up a desired job description
- What are the required and preferred skills they are looking for?
- Transfer them onto your LinkedIn if you have those skills!



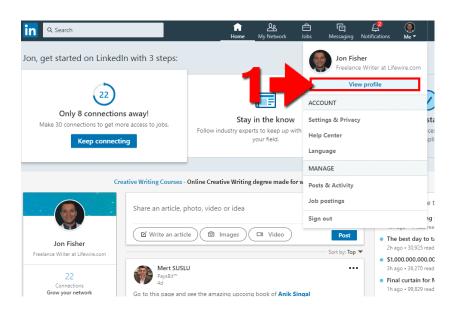
Skills and Endorsements



- Endorse the skills of your connections
- Request they endorse your skills
- Let LinkedIn do all the work



Customized LinkedIn Profile Address

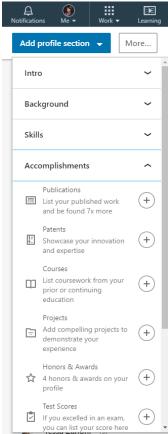


- Short and easy to type
- On your resume: replace your street address with your LinkedIn URL

Resume \(\neq \text{LinkedIn: 6 Key Differences} \)

Resume

LinkedIn

Short. Simple.

Tell a bigger story.

One page. Static.

As long as you like (within reason). Dynamic.

Tailored to each job application.

Bigger picture. Broader audience.

Multiple resumes.

One LinkedIn Profile.

Face value.

Back-up your talents with media.

Highly visualized.

What you see is what you get.

Conversational. Social.

Formal language.

Never in the first person.

Always use "I" statements.

- **3. Elaborate** on things you are proud of but could not include in your resume.
- **4.** Add the color your resume lacks!
- 5. Promote the same message about you and your value.

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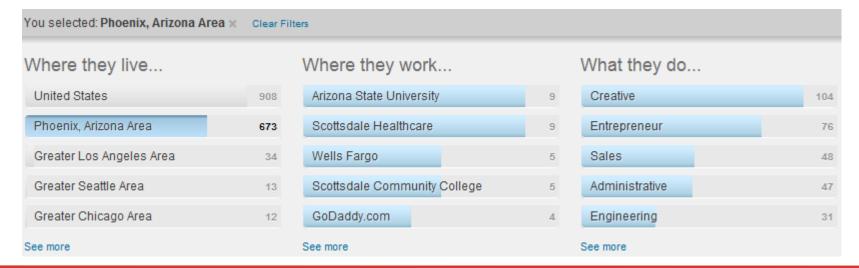
Adding New Connections

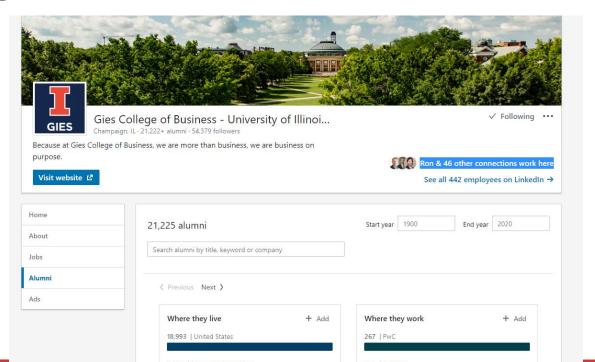

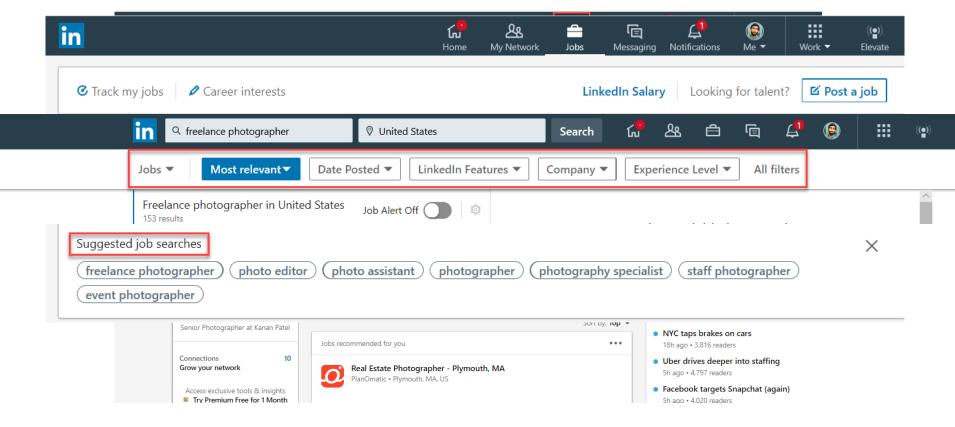

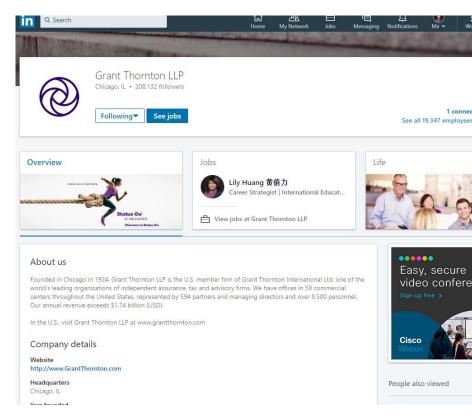

Train LinkedIn to Work for You



- Customize your feed
- Manage and update your preferences on suggested posts, news, people content
- Follow or unfollow people, companies and influencers
- Hide posts that aren't relevant
 - Click the 3-dots on the top right and select hide post
- Report inappropriate content



Engage Your Connections

- Find alumni and employees of target companies
- Reach out on LinkedIn
- Invite for informational interview in person or over phone calls
- Like and comment on their posts
- Connect with their connections
- Continue to engage with them over time
- Ask for referrals, recommendations, tips, etc.

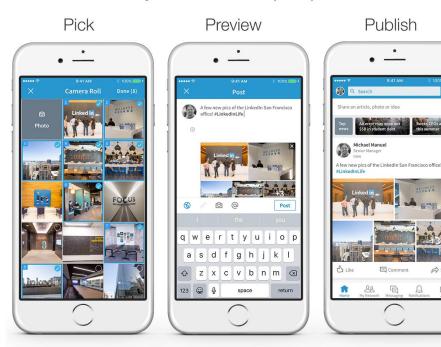
