Fact # 2: The world today is increasingly globalized






CAREER TIP:

- In order to stay competitive, you need to approach your career search with a global mindset.
- Be open-minded and flexible
 when it comes to targeting
 opportunities (e.g. type of
 company, geographic location,
 type of role, etc.)
- Conduct a search that is not too narrow or too broad



Fact # 3: "Soft skills" are as important as the "hard skills"

- Employers value candidates who are "career-ready"
- "Career-ready" is defined by the 8 competencies (shown in the table)*
- Employers are looking for a combination of "soft" and "hard" skills



Career Tips

- Know your strengths and weaknesses
- Know which skills are valued in your target role/industry
- Focus on developing your soft skills (it's not just about a high GPA!)
- Develop your skills and knowledge during your time at Illinois by being involved with activities & events and engaging with our diverse community!

CAREER SKILLS TRAINING & RESOURCES

- Live and online workshop topics such as job search strategies, resume writing, interviewing, LinkedIn, personal branding, exploring careers in specific industries, and more!
- Provide career resources such as online job boards (Handshake) and career platforms to help you practice interviewing; provide a library of career videos and tutorials
- Industry sharing talks and networking events with alumni and industry executives



CAREER ADVISING

- One-on-one sessions with a career advisor
- Safe environment to discuss any career-related topics or questions such as reviewing your career marketing materials (resume, LinkedIn, cover letter), practice interviewing, how to search for jobs or simply bouncing off ideas!



CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

- Develop and maintain relationships with select employers to provide opportunities to Gies business students

Target Audience	Campus-wide (all UI students)	Gies College of Business students only
How to log in?	Career Services will set up accounts for students after they have registered for classes. Please do NOT create your own account. Website: handshake.illinois.edu	Once you register for classes, your account will be set up so you should be able to log in using your netID. Please do NOT create your own account. Website: giesgroups.Illinois.edu
